## **Teréga is making an active contribution to tomorrow's energy model**

**2017 overview:**

**In 2017, Teréga, France's leading independent gas infrastructures operator generated revenues of €471m, in line with its targets.**

Its Transport business generated a turnover of €294m, and its Storage business, €177m.

**Teréga has pursued its investment strategy in gas infrastructure with a view to ensuring fluidity in the national market.**

Its investments over the 2017 financial year totalled €177m:

- €152m for its transport business mainly in development investments, particularly the Renforcement Gascogne Midi - RGM project for new pipelines aimed at supporting the launch of Trading Region France (TRF) on 1 November 2018. The year was also marked by investment in the modernisation, safety and maintenance of infrastructure.
- €25m for its storage business mainly in investment in the modernisation, safety and maintenance of infrastructure. Two new wells were added to the storage sites with a view to securing supply and enhancing storage performance.

**2018 outlook:**

**This momentum is set to continue in a fully regulated environment.**

In 2018, in a new context, as all company activities are now regulated, the pace of investment remains high and results, in November 2018, in the implementation of the TRF, in which Teréga will act as co-facilitator. In the area of natural gas storage, the company, reinforced by a successful 2018 commercialisation campaign, intends to pursue its investment programme and has already created two new wells.

## **Teréga has allowed gas and its infrastructure to play a role as accelerator in the energy transition.**

Against a backdrop of rapid transformation in the energy industry, Teréga's new corporate identity, launched in late March 2018, reflects the momentum gained by the IMPACTS 2025 transformation plan on the path towards realising its ambitions in tomorrow's energy landscape. Teréga has taken this step to support the development of renewable gas, particularly biomethane and power-to-gas. Teréga is also using its BE POSITIF programme (positive environmental performance) to achieve a zero carbon footprint throughout its activities by 2020, and to generate environmental value from 2025, a voluntary approach in keeping with its vision of a sustainable future.

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The company has long been established in the south-west of France, and has 5,055 km of pipelines and 2 underground storage sites, accounting respectively for 16% of the French gas transport network and 24.5% of national storage capacity.

In 2017, it generated revenue of €471m and has more than 590 employees.
